This volume is the final and formal record of almost a year of activities of the second NACSIS/NII Test Collection for Information Retrieval (NTCIR) Workshop. I believe that the NTCIR Workshop has already become an important event in the global information retrieval research arena.

Many people have worked hard to organize this workshop, and, among others, I would like to mention Dr. Noriko Kando, Dr. Kazuko Kuriyama, Dr. Kenro Aihara, Dr. Masaharu Yoshioka, Dr. Koji Eguchi, Dr. Keizo Oyama, Dr. Hiroyuki Kato, Dr. Ichiro Ide, Ms Yuko Miyamoto and Ms Urara Numata for their every endeavor to make this workshop successful.
