After the subsequent formation of the Heng Samrin administration, he was sentenced to death for "the crime of a national slaughter" by the people's court from which Pol Pot himself was absent. If an article is about the war crimes of Pol Pot including the Killing Fields while he was alive, it is relevant. If an article is about the war crimes or is about the speed of the Prime Minister's resignation, it is partially relevant.

At the international conference held in Ottawa in October 1996, sponsored by the Canadian government, rapid movement toward establishment of the treaty, called the "Ottawa Process", started. Through the United Nations General Assembly resolution in December 1996, or a series of negotiations between many countries, the treaty was adopted at the treaty negotiation meeting (89 nations participated) held in Oslo, Norway, in September 1997, and 122 nations signed in December of the same year. This treaty went into effect in March 1999, when 117 nations had ratified it. If an article is about the correspondence of each country regarding the ratification of this treaty, it is relevant.
